

HELP OTHERS

If you see someone who is being assaulted or witness a child, teen, adult or elder in immediate danger, call 911 or local law enforcement immediately.

HELP A TEEN WHO HAS AN ABUSIVE PARTNER

Share concerns with parents/guardian or trusted adult. Consult the National Teen Dating Violence Helpline at 866-331-9474. Calls are anonymous.

HELP A CHILD OR TEEN WHO IS BEING ABUSED

To make a report of abuse or neglect, call the 24-hour Franklin County Children Services hotline at (614) 229-7000. All calls are confidential.

HELP A SENIOR CITIZEN WHO IS BEING ABUSED

To make a report regarding suspicions of elder abuse or neglect, call Adult Protective Services at (614) 525-4348. All calls are confidential. Office hours are Monday - Friday from 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.

Programs and Services

CHILD ASSESSMENT CENTER

The Child Assessment Center provides responsive and timely medical assessment and treatment along with interviews of children and family members who may have experienced child abuse or neglect. Children and adolescents are seen for comprehensive evaluations of alleged abuse or neglect.

FAMILY SUPPORT PROGRAM

The Family Support Program, provided by Nationwide Children's Behavioral Health Services, offers counseling for children and adolescents who have been sexually or physically abused or exposed to family violence. Parent training is provided for families whose children are at risk for abuse or neglect.

HOME BASED TEAM

The Home Based Team, provided by Nationwide Children's Behavioral Health Services, offers intervention within the home and community setting utilizing evidence-based interventions to assist caregivers in developing a strong relationship with their child and learning healthy, effective discipline strategies.

The Fostering Connections Program is a specialized foster care clinic offering comprehensive health care services to children and adolescents placed in out-of-home care.

NURSE FAMILY PARTNERSHIP

Nurse Family Partnership (NFP) provides nurse home visitation to first-time, low-income mothers from early pregnancy through the child's second birthday. NFP improves pregnancy outcomes by encouraging preventive health practices that enhance child health outcomes.
