



## ***WHERE'S THE LINE?***

At The Center for Family Safety and Healing (TCFSH), we work diligently to break the cycle of family violence through advocacy, prevention, intervention, treatment and research. More recently, we have asked the central Ohio community to join us in addressing family violence through the launch of our [\*Where's The Line?\*](#) campaign, which focuses on providing information and tools to bystanders.

At the heart of *Where's the Line?* is a newly created resource line specifically designed to educate bystanders on how to recognize and appropriately address the signs of family violence. The bystander will also be provided with appropriate resources to help address the related concerns.

The resource line does not replace 9-1-1 or any other crisis lines in the case of an emergency. However, for non-emergency calls, bystanders can dial 844-234-LINE, text 87028, or send an instant message via [www.familyandsafetyandhealing.org](http://www.familyandsafetyandhealing.org). All calls, texts and instant messages are always anonymous and confidential, and will be answered by our Information Coordinator from 12:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

The campaign also features a targeted on-air commercial and online resources, as well as print ads and wallscapes visible throughout central Ohio. We hope these visual reminders will empower residents to recognize the signs of family violence and resist the urge to look the other way. Join us in spreading the word, and help send a resounding message that victims of family violence are not alone.
